



Fans may not need to wait much longer as he's been motivated by his close circle of friends and Mom who's reportedly telling him "Anything worth having is worth fighting for."



They've been caught up in a lost passport fiasco for days, and are awaiting news to see if they'll make their show in Montreal.

TBLSH released their newest album. Emergency Leisure, earlier this summer. "Prefecture." One unnamed superfan One critic called it "a celebratory dance party with existentialism lurking in the background." Supporting their tour is French-disco-punk sensations Choses Sauvages, affectionately referred to as "Sweet Sausages."



ONE OF AUSTIN'S GREATEST DJS, **BUCK RODGERS, IS EXPANDING** HIS MUSICAL TALENTS INTO GALAXIES UNKNOWN. His newest project Jumping Planets, a collaboration with Blackillac co-founder ZEALE, has them bouncing between genres more than ever before.

The self-taught one-man drum machine is experimenting with more electronic sounds as popular hip-hop and club gigs have started to fall off his radar. Fans are eager to see what's next for the Goldie Award World Beat Champion. Buck knows that when he's HYPEr focused on something, he will undoubtedly put in the work.

We believe it too. Footage was just released from the vault showing Buck playing drums as a kindergartner at his very first live gig, proving that he has the longevity to go all the way. Which way is that? No one knows yet. But this finger-drumming turntable aficionado exclusively told us that it will be a cinematic experience.

Producers share their "secret recipe" for a great track within their scene. It's less about the formula and more about the tools and workflow to expose tips and inspiration!

1

My vibe: futuristic fingerlicious beats with hella BUCKness. I'm never really going for a specific theme but most of my music is dark. Current fav BPMs are 75, 87 & 122. I've been into jumping genres—more electronic sounds, especially drum & bass. I love Splice for taking samples and super-stretching them into a whole new world of sound.

2 GEAR Everything runs through Ableton on my Macbook Pro M1 Max. I'm known for finger drumming on Native Instruments Maschine Mk3 but I rarely produce with it. Instead I use a M-Audio Oxygen 25 midi keyboard. Xfer Serum is my go-to VST, along with LennarDigital's Sylenth1 and NI Massive, then The God Particle for mastering. My secret sauce: \$50 CCA C12 in-ear monitors—I have six pairs and use them every day.

3 LIVE I perform on a Pioneer DJM-S11 Mixer, two PLX-1000 turntables, plus my Maschine Mk3—but I want a cross fader on a fucking drum machine so I'm building my own. I convinced Pioneer to add a cross-pitch step button on their new mixer out this month. I'm a one-man show, adding live visuals via APC 40, Roland VR-4HD switcher and EVGA XR1 stream deck for a cinematic experience. Gotta keep up or get left behind.







WHEN DID YOU PICK UP PHOTOGRAPHY?

They met at Goodtype. Now they are Goodtype. It's a place for type lovers to connect. nerd out, and level up.

Bode Robinson founded the community on Instagram in 2013 and handed the reins to Ilana Griffo and Katie Johnson in 2021. Along with an expansive community of artists, letterers and designers, Katie and Ilana inherited a global audience.

Before they started running Goodtype, Katie and Ilana were lettering artists on

similar trajectories.

They left Art Director positions to explore their entrepreneurial sides. Their similar experiences made them a perfect yin and yang when working on something even larger.

This Nov. 1–3, they're hosting their 2nd annual Kernference: a 3-day virtual summit designed to bring the typography community together. It features talks, demos, and panels from heavy hitters and emerging talent in the industry. The reach is infinite. People from all different styles


of art and perspectives of human experience come together from around the world to do what they love the most—get super nerdy about type!

Equally important is the emphasis on the business side of creativity to give artists the resources they need to make money from their passion.

Just like design, learning to run a business was a process. "It's weird—when you step into a new role and you feel like you should get some sort of certificate but there's none of that. You just make up your title and keep saying it," Katie leveled. "There's a huge learning curve—diving into things that you don't know how to do... figuring it out, learning, failing."

The process of it all clearly excites them. Now they are using their experience to build an inviting, accessible community and Kernference with mentorship on how to successfully apply your creative skills to business. "We underestimate the power of creating your own world.

We can imagine and be creative to figure it out and with a little ambition you're there," Katie shares. Creativity is the path and the solution. The best thing you can do is "enjoy what you're doing and survive doing it."





Armadillo Christmas Bazaar (ACB) has changed a lot since its humble beginnings in 1976, and so has its perception.

Anne Johnson joined the ACB family when she was five years old so her understanding of the early years relies on mysteriously shrouded stories from the then inner circle.

It all began at Armadillo World Headquarters when Lucinda Williams told Bruce Willenzik, AWHQ kitchen manager, "too bad the artists down on the drag don't have a warm, dry place like this to sell their art for Christmas." AWHQ was Austin's premiere concert venue, a counter-cultural institution known for out-of-the-box thinking and big shows including Willie Nelson, Jerry Garcia and Van Morrison. It was a magnet for creative energy

and now, thanks to Lucinda and Bruce, the cultural hub expanded its influence into the art world.

At AWHQ and ACB's next venues, including Austin Music Hall, the environment was more akin to a nightclub—focused on the music and the party, but showed great potential for growth throughout the decades.

Making the jump to the Convention Center in 2008 and then Palmer Events Center in 2010 opened a lot of doors for Armadillo—buyers felt comfortable spending more money, they upgraded from 8,000 sq. ft. to 44,000, and professional touring artists from around the country began to flock. ACB is still the only fine art show on the national circuit.

2010 also happened to be the year that Anne stepped into a producer role at

the Bazaar. She had seen the growth and learned Bruce's world to carry on the torch as an institution where Austin artists can step up to the national level. Anne's goal is to identify up-andcoming talent to offer mentorship and materials to help them grow and

find success at ACB and beyond.

Anne is full of advice. When I told her this issue is themed HYPE, she knew exactly what we were talking about: confidence. We launched into conversation and she ended with, "Buyers can see how you value your work and they're going to mirror that. Perception is everything."

Zooming out, we can find a parallel with ACB's history. When they were a holiday party market, people partied. Now as a one-of-a-kind fine art institution featuring over 200 artists, people buy art. Of course they've also kept their music side thriving—four bands will perform each day this year. Plus, we at Almost Real Things will be bringing out some gifts and fun for this year's interactive Armadillo Artway just outside the front doors from Dec 15-17.

Throughout all of Austin's growth, ACB has played to its strengths while staying flexible enough to stand the test of time. "I'm happy for Austin! I'm happy that the Bazaar has been able to grow with it. One of the wonderful things about new Austin is that we're still here!"

It's Beat Sessions—an ephemeral creative showdown centered around uplifting artists and just having fun making art—something that is often overshadowed by deadlines and obligations once you reach a certain level in your career.

It's a IYKYK kind of event, underground enough to remain cool but not so exclusive that anyone feels unwelcome. Newcomers quickly turn into regulars as the communal atmosphere is as intoxicating as the spray paint.

Beat Sessions is a collaboration between Blue Dozen Collective (BDC), Spokesman Coffee, Goose Prints, MC Dee Green, Darkmode Photo, Abe "The Ambassador" and even more creatives donating their time, connections and talent to make something beautiful for the community.

What is now one of Texas's longest running paint battles was the brainchild of BDC members Briks & FISH, the former who also co-founded BDC back in 2008 after moving to Austin from Houston.

For Briks, forming BDC was a push for character-based artists like himself to work together rather than individually.

Today BDC is a collective of 37 artists and still growing. Though Texas is home base, there are artists based in Austria, New York and Tennessee.

FISH describes it as artist hospitality: "It's a family network that you can take advantage of with art at the core."

Beat Sessions is a consistent touch point with the community and a celebration of everyone's growth. With its success, BDC plans to expand their outreach, specifically to let kids and young artists know about the opportunities out here for them.

"We want artists to know you can create these opportunities for yourself," shares Briks. "You don't have to be in Austin or be invited to do something creative. You can make the thing."


